About Pre-AP

- Pre-AP courses are on-grade level academically advanced courses designed to <u>challenge motivated students</u> to understand <u>rigorous content</u>.
- The coursework requires students to engage in independent and analytical assignments and to complete a substantial amount of work outside of class.
- Pre-AP middle school courses are designed to prepare students for high school Pre-AP and Advanced Placement (AP) courses.
- AP courses are college-level courses taught in a high school setting. At the end of each AP course an AP Exam is given. Qualifying scores on the AP exams can enable students to receive college credit and/or advanced standing at a university or college.

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ASK TEACHERS FOR HELP

Pre-AP Enrollment

- 1) Must have met the passing standard (satisfactory or advanced) on WRAT, Nelson & Brigance Tests
- And/or Student must have passed the preceding grade level with a minimum SBG level of 3 in a Pre-AP program or regular classes.
- Students who do not meet the above criteria may request a meeting with the Asst. Principal of C&I, Counselor and Pre-AP Teacher Representative to discuss enrollment.
- 4) Students must complete a Pre-AP/AP Agreement
 (Students without a valid agreement on file by the end of the 1st grading period will be exited from the course.)

Exiting Pre-AP

• A student may exit Pre-AP within the first several weeks of the 1st grading period by making a request through his/her counselor (all others will be approved on a case by case basis, with admin approval.

• After the 1st progress period, a student may only exit Pre-AP at the end of the first semester to enroll in the regular team.

• Any time a student exits from a Pre-AP, his/her grade point scale will transfer to the regular subject courses.

• If a student's average is below SBG Level 3 at the end of the first semester, he/she is required to exit the course and enroll in the level course of the same subject.

• If at the the grading periods, a student's grade falls below SBG Level 3, the student and parent will be required to meet with the Pre-AP Team and Admin.

• Probation letters will be sent out to parents of students who fall below proficiency levels, and interventions will be applied.


